Updates from the School Office

There are occasional times that the office needs to be closed during the school day. One of these times is when Mary has to count and verify monies received from fund-raising events. Criminal Record Checks

All volunteer criminal record checks are now done through the Ministry of Justice. There is no charge for these. If you need an updated CRC, or haven't done one yet, the forms can be found on the school web site or can be picked up from the school office. Please let us know if you complete one on-line as these approved CRCs get sent to our Superintendent by the Ministry of Justice and she doesn't know which school parents are connected with.
