WHAT ARE STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES?

• Student-led conferences are exactly what they imply; students take the lead in sharing examples of their work, discussing next steps in their learning, and setting goals for further learning

WHAT IS THEIR PURPOSE?

- To encourage students to accept personal responsibility for their learning
- To teach students the process of self-evaluation and reflection
- To promote an open dialogue between parents and students about the students' learning

• To provide students with the opportunity to showcase their work and explain their academic achievements WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

- Greater accountability in students for their own learning
- Increased pride in their achievements
- Increased confidence and independence
- Furthering positive parent-child communication in a relaxed, non-threatening atmosphere

Details about scheduling of the conferences will be sent home next week! The beauty if this type of structure is you can take as much or as little time as you have (we recommend a minimum of 20 to 30 minutes for each student-led conference; some students love to take longer and this structure allows for that). Parents, please remember that these conferences **provide your child with an opportunity to shine**! If you need to have a serious discussion with the teacher, please schedule another time for this meeting. Your engagement is with your child not the teacher during student-led conferences.
