HALLOWE'EN FUN at the school. Students may wear costumes to school on October 31st. For safety reasons, students are not to wear masks; instead, they can decorate their faces if they want. Costumes that depict violence or other things deemed inappropriate for a Catholic school must be avoided. Classrooms will enjoy a variety of Hallowe'en activities that day.

On **November 3rd** we move into the season for <u>winter uniforms</u>. Long pants, rather than shorts, are to be worn. Girls should be wearing navy or white tights or leggings. Except for conditions of heavier rain or extreme cold, students go outside before school, during recess, and at lunch play time. Please check the weather forecast and have your children wear suitable outer clothing (e.g. winter jackets, mitts, boots, and scarves on cold days).

ALLERGEN AWARE SCHOOL

It is the policy of the Catholic Independent Schools of the Kamloops Diocese to create allergen-aware environments in our schools. As a school community, we are aware that students who have potentially life-threatening allergies can go into anaphylactic shock. We have protocols in place in such an event. We do ask the cooperation of parents to be sensitive to the requirements of some of our students.
