

- If anyone has <u>fundraising ideas</u> for the 2015-2016 school year, please bring your ideas to the PSG meeting on MONDAY, MAY 4<sup>th</sup>. All suggestions for fundraising also need to have the name of a person willing to coordinate the event. The PSG members (executive and any other parents who attend the May meeting) will vote on the fundraising events for the upcoming school year.
- The revenue from the Vegas Pub Night was \$9259.00 with expenses of \$3193.33, and a net profit of \$6065.67. A huge thanks goes out to all the organizers, to the many parents who brought in donations for the auctions and other gift venues, and to the people who attended the event.
- The Bloom Time Flower fundraiser had revenue of \$5500.00 with expenses of \$4300.00, and a net profit of \$1200.00. This was the first year we have done this particular fundraiser and the response was terrific.

## Mental Health Matters - Presentation on May 14th at OLOV

Mental health issues affect all of us, either personally, socially or economically, and that is why we are hoping that everyone will join us for a most valuable and important presentation on this, one of the most widespread health issues in the country.

This subject has often been a social taboo, not to be talked about, but it is important that it be brought out into the openthat we become aware of, and educated about, mental health issues. Some of these issues include depression, anxiety, grieving and loss, suicidal thoughts, alcoholism/drugs or schizophrenia. One in five Canadians experiences a mental health concern each year. Even though we may not personally experience mental illness first-hand, it is likely that we all know someone who has, or will have, a mental illness.

For anyone facing mental illness, the stigma may be harder to deal with than the illness itself. It can seriously damage how people feel about themselves and how others see them. In fact, it is the leading reason why two-thirds of people living with mental illness don't seek help. Through open conversation, we will be able to find ways to change the stigma and fear of mental illness.

The St. James CWL council will be hosting a presentation by the Mental Illness Family Support Centre on May 14<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 to 8:45pm in the Narthex of Our Lady of the Valley Church. We will hear the personal stories of a person living with a mental illness, a family member and a mental health professional. They will present valuable information about the resources available to us here in Vernon. The CWL encourages you to attend this presentation and invite others to come as well, in order to challenge our understanding and attitudes about Mental Health and Mental Illness.
